Since 1964, the Board of Trustees of the Educational Foundation has distributed nearly \$1.7

million in its efforts to improve, enrich and encourage intercultural understanding and excellence in education.

Thanks to the Educational Foundation 27 projects will continue. More than \$52,300 was awarded to renewal projects ranging from numerous groups distributing books to babies, special needs students, ELL learners, libraries and other countries to childcare scholarships for Latino families and a therapy dog in the reading classroom.



More than \$80,925 was awarded to 50 new projects. These projects support new activities such as assistance in purchasing educational materials including binoculars, graphing calculators, maps and globes as well as providing help for learners in Nepal, Zambia, Sierra Leone, Siwa (Egypt) and First Nation students in New Brunswick.
