OPERATION AGUA

Eta Raises Money for Clean Drinking Water bu Sherry Alimi-Kent

Members of Eta Chapter, as part of our support in the area of World Fellowship, focused on hurricane damage in the Caribbean. Bonnie Waterer presented a very interesting slide show about her 2012 People to People trip to Cuba and added some slides of a trip she took to Puerto Rico. At the end of her program Sherry Alimi spoke briefly about how she learned about the program to provide water filtration systems for Puerto Rican homes. Each filter produces 10 gallons daily of clean drinking water for a family. This program was proposed by Puerto Rican teachers and supported by the American Federation of Teachers. Donations are tax-deductible and all donations go directly to purchasing water filters (no overhead). The program is called Operation Agua. Donations can be given online or by check. Eta Chapter members generously provided \$300 in checks and \$142 in cash and \$210 online, a total of \$642, twenty-one water filters. Members who were absent can still support this worthwhile program by sending a check to Norma or by giving online. Just Google the words Operation Agua and look for the AFT. Thank you, Eta members. Twenty-one families are drinking clean water thanks to you.

Program: Bonnie's presentation was based on her cultural exchange tour with the People to People Organization in 2012. The pictures were from Puerto Rico and Cuba; both tours done the same year using local guides. Many buildings were in need of significant repair along with a fleet of old cars. The capital building is of American design. Cathedrals still show their magnificence but religion is not encouraged. Many buildings have art work as paintings (like the Che Guevara mural) and intricate tile work. There is a cultural emphasis on music with musicians playing at many restaurants. Bonnie and her husband toured such places as Old Havana, Plaza de la Revolution, the San Francisco Plaza, The Nacional Hotel (build in 1930), a geriatric center, a recording studio, and even an organic farm. Some activities were restricted in Cuba such as access to beaches and certain areas were not to be photographed.

Sherry A. presented Operation Agua, a program to provide water filtration systems for Puerto Rican homes - a program proposed by Puerto Rican teachers and supported by the American Federation of Teachers. Each filter produces 10 gallons daily of clean drinking water for a family. Many of our chapter members made donations for a total of \$642 which will be sent directly to purchasing these badly needed water filters. The filters cost \$30 each. Members not present for this meeting also have an opportunity to donate by sending a check to Norma or by giving online.

Business Meeting:

- Formal installation of officers was performed by Sherry B. for the 2018-2020 biennium:
 Joyce Moore President; Georgia Davidson 1st Vice President; Sherry A 2nd Vice President; and
 Helen M– Secretary. Norma continues as Treasurer and Wally Turner becomes Parliamentarian.
- 2. Kris F. reported that Erin Harris was the only applicant for our scholarship. After a brief discussion Sherry B. moved and Veronica seconded a motion to award the scholarship to Erin in the amount of \$1,500. Because a quorum was present, the motion carried.
- 3. Convention Up-Dates:
 - a. Housing needs volunteers to hostess presently include Joyce, Norma, Sherry A., Chris F., and Barbara S.

- 5. Joyce listed some upcoming programs for next year including some favorites such as the Art Students in February and the Honors Brunch. Suggested new programs include Essential Oils, Waters Nursery, Sit & Be Fit, Launch Pad, a Planetarium visit, and Prescott's Police Chief Debora Black. We welcome other suggestions, especially for the 2019-2020 year.


