A Message from our President...



Healing Shawls

Our healing shawls are one way of reaching out to breast cancer patients.

Knitting a healing shawl is a simple project which means so much to the recipient. Barbara Hilli has led the way with the shawls. A small DKG label is fastened to the corner of each shawl before it is brought to the Norma Pfriem Breast Cancer Center either at Bridgeport Hospital or in Fairfield.

Nine shawls were delivered in May to Bridgeport Hospital. To get involved is easy. Barbara (left hand knitter) or Marcia will be happy to get you started. You will need a set of size 13 knitting needles, 2 skeins of either Red Heart Light and Lofty or Baby Cloud or 2 skeins of Lion Brand Homespun. You choose the color. Yarn is available at stores like Joanne's, Michael's or WalMart and is not expensive.

Directions for making a shawl:

The directions are as follows: Cast on 45 stitches. Garter stitch (just regular knit stitch) all rows. Knit around 55-60 inches saving enough yarn to make fringe or make fringe from a contrasting color yarn. It is fun to knit; it is therapeutic for the knitter and the recipient. If you don't have time to knit but would like to donate yarn, it will gladly be accepted. When you finish a shawl, please let Barbara know so that a label can be sewn inside.
