

A Message from our President

September 2013

I'm very pleased to have completed the first year of a two-year biennium as BETA's president and to begin the second year of my biennium still standing on two feet. Many thanks to Jo-Anne Kershaw and my very able Board for helping me accomplish that feat. Happily, I experienced my first summer of the last three without having foot surgery.

Our first meeting will take place at *Stanziale's Restaurant*, 595 Main Street in Stratford, Wednesday, Oct. 2nd at 4:30 pm. We've been there before; it's easy to find with ample parking and good food. We will initiate Patti Sorrentino-Galello into our chapter at the meeting. Our speaker will be Lisa Acerbo, author and teacher. at Trumbull High School. Her first book, Apocalipstick takes place in a post-apocalyptic world occupied by zombies and a group of outsiders called the "others." Her main character is also caught in a love triangle. Acerbo's first foray into fiction came out Aug. 1, published by Eternal Press. Going into her sixth year as a high school teacher, she has also read all the popular young adult novels her students read, like *Twilight* and *The Hunger Games*. She says her book fits into the "new adult" category, for older teens and people in their 20s. BETA's executive board voted to ask members to bring nonperishable food for the Trumbull Food Bank to this meeting.

Our second meeting will be at Frenchtown School, Wednesday, November 20th. Our speaker will be Debbie Gilbert Taylor, artist and nutritionist. Ms. Gilbert always knew she was an artist, but it took decades to give herself permission to call herself one. Art played an important but secondary role in her life until recently. Inspired by nature and curiosity, Debbie observes and uses color, form and texture to inform her work. She gravitates toward the dimensional and often uses sculptural elements in her mixed media projects. Ms. Gilbert has exhibited in juried shows at the Barnum Museum, the SPAG Gallery, The Gallery of Contemporary Art at Sacred Heart University, Ridgefield Guild of Artists, Housatonic Museum of Art and the Bromfield Gallery in Boston, among others. She has been awarded prizes for ink drawings and photographs and a piece is included in the Town of Stratford's art collection. Debbie has also been commissioned for photos in Positive People Magazine, for the cover of "The Best 10 Minute Plays for 3 or more Actors, 2008 edition," and for a generational themed sculpture at the Jewish Community Center of Greater New Haven. Ms. Gilbert founded the Stratford Arts Guild in 2006 and currently serves as the Corresponding Secretary of the Women's Caucus for Art. She is also a member of the Connecticut Sculpture Society and the Valley Arts Council. A native New Yorker, Debbie moved to Connecticut in 1983 and resides in Stratford CT with her husband Jim. Her son Jared recently graduated from Emerson College in Boston and works for the Disney Channel in LA. Her son David attends the University of New Haven and studies music business.

Our third meeting is *Wednesday, March 19, 2014 (snow date March 26), and it too will be held at Frenchtown*. Our speaker will be Jolene Mullen, genealogist & CTDAR Officer. Jolene Mullen is a professional researcher specializing in lineage research for heritage societies. She works in Connecticut and the eastern counties of New York, in the New York and Connecticut state libraries/archives, and other repositories and states as necessary. Her book, *Connecticut's Town Meeting Records during the American Revolution*, was published in 2011. She is currently working on Rhode Island town meeting records during the revolution and a prosopography of a Washington County, NY, cemetery. She will discuss research methodology, record groups (genealogical data to look for and where to find them) and useful internet sites (both subscription and free). Jolene Mullen is a member of the Connecticut Professional Genealogists Council and the Association of Professional Genealogists.

There were smiles all around when the books were presented to Beardsley's librarian, Theresa Welch.

The children were especially thrilled to receive *Pete the Cat and His Four Groovy Buttons*, the newest in a series by Eric Litwin; Pete the Cat is a very popular character! From I-95 Southbound (New Haven): Take EXIT 32 toward WEST BROAD ST/STRATFORD (drive .2 miles), Turn SLIGHT LEFT onto LINDEN AVE.

Turn LEFT onto W BROAD ST. Pass through 1 roundabout (drive .2 miles).

Turn RIGHT onto MAIN ST/CT-113 (drive 1.4 miles). Stanziale's Restaurant is on the right side.
