

She loves working with young children and is continuously looking for ways to develop and enhance her students' learning. The "Aha Moments" her children experience fill Dawn with great joy. She looks expectantly to her remaining years in education and with Alpha Kappa.

Charter Member of AK Reflects on Teaching, FSU History

"Teaching is such a rewarding profession ... and once a teacher always a teacher. We hire UF students to ride/exercise the eight horses here at the farm. I am accused of asking the riders once a week: How are classes coming along?" And many times I get into a good discussion on learning. My friends then repeat the phrase "always a teacher." I can't help it – it's just me."

Dr. Frances C. Cannon, one of the 23 women who signed the AK Chapter Charter in 1959, lives in Gainesville, Florida. She wrote this reflection in a July 13, 2019, letter, acknowledging receipt of photos and the program from AK chapter's celebration luncheon on June 27, 2019.

Dr. Cannon, FSU Professor Emerita, was on the Leisure Services faculty, 1961-1991. She earned her bachelor's degree in Physical Education from Florida State College for Women (1947) and her master's degree from FSU (1948). In 1962 she received a DKG Scholarship to complete her Ed.D. at FSU.

Dr. Cannon is one of four alumnae in the FSU classes of 1946-1948 whom FSU credits with the idea and fundraising for Heritage Tower constructed at FSU University Center in 1998. The tower is known as "The Torch" for the three torches at the top.

About "The Torch," Dr. Cannon reflected (July 13, 2019): "Yea, I had great fun with Mary Lou (Norwood) and the others (Sarah Lewis Marxson and Shirly Rodgers Tellander) in planning the torch statue, raising the money and watching it being built and dedicated. I was thrilled when asked to deliver the address at the dedication, where we had those attending to light a candle and "pass the torch" to the person next to them. You may recognize pictures of the three torches that are used on so many FSU publications. Great memories."
