



ADMINISTRATION

The Lambda State Foundation for Educational Studies, Inc. operates as an independent corporation under the umbrella of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, Lambda State (IL) Organization.

The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International is an honorary professional organization for women in education. Lambda State has approximately 3,500 members.

MISSION STATEMENT

The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International promotes professional and personal growth of women educators and excellence in education.

The Board of Directors shall control and manage all the affairs and assets of the Foundation.

The Board of Directors shall make contracts and purchases, direct all expenditures, and shall administer the affairs of the Foundation to fulfill the purposes of the Foundation.

FOUNDATION FUND

The Foundation Fund consists of invested principal, income from investments, contributions, and bequests from Lottie Skidmore, Alfreda Chalberg, Martha A. Slyter, and Patricia M. Ostewig.

The income from the invested funds and designated contributions are used for stipends and for administrative expenses.

All contributions are considered principal for investment unless otherwise designated by the donor.

Copies of the bylaws are available from the Foundation secretary.

Foundation funds are obtained from donations, bequests, gifts, and grants. The Board of Directors reserves the final option for the acceptance of a prospective charitable gift.

Grants of money from other foundations or governmental agencies become income to be used, primarily, for education projects stipends.

STIPENDS

The Foundation Fund income supports research and projects proposed by members of the Lambda State Organization. The programs funded are designed to improve the quality of education in Illinois.

The Board of Directors screens applications and makes awards based on its assessment of the projected benefits to education. Deadline date is May 1st or November 1st for applications.

Applications for stipends are available from the Foundation secretary or on the Lambda State Web site.

Stipends awarded vary in amount depending on the project plan submitted in the application and available funds. During the first 25 years, the Foundation awarded stipends totaling \$122,196.95.

Foundation supported projects are shared with Lambda State members through workshops, presentations and by other communications.

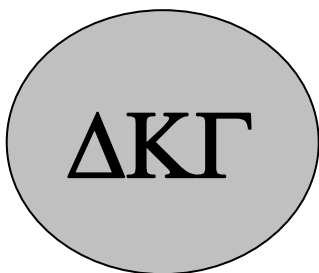
IMPROVEMENT OF EDUCATION
