TITLE IX AND BULLYING

Although there is currently pending legislation in the House of Representatives (H.R.458) about attempting to enforce Title IX as it relates to sports in elementary and high schools, no corresponding bill has been introduced in the Senate in this session of Congress. Bullying in schools has been addressed in the law under Title IX with complaints going to the Office of Civil Rights (OCR) in the Department of Education. AAUW has produced a long report on bullying and has made PowerPoint presentations available to the public on line.
