The Paycheck Fairness Act died in the Senate without a vote being taken.

National women �s history museum

After passing the House of Representatives on a voice vote and unanimously passing the Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works in the 2009-10 session of Congress, two senators -- Jim DeMint (R, SC) and Tom Coburn (R, OK) -- placed holds on the bill. Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid agreed to attach the bill to two other larger bills at the end of the session but neither bill came to the floor. Ultimately, Senator Reid ran out of time. Senators DeMint and Coburn should not prevent the recognition and honoring of women's lives and their contributions to shaping our nation. The mission of the National Women s History Museum is to build the first ever national museum in Washington, D.C., dedicated exclusively to women's history. It will be controlly located near the world second page the world sec

centrally located near the world �s most prestigious museums and monuments in our Nation �s Capital. A new bill will be introduced in the 2011-12 session of Congress.

NWHM plans to hire a female architect. The Museum will be the first museum on the Mall designed by a woman.

HEART FOR WOMEN ACT

Part of the original bill was placed in the large health care bill passed in 2010. The part of the bill which required studies of heart disease in women and access to diagnosis and treatment of women �\$s heart disease was not passed and will be reintroduced in the next session of Congress.

TITLE IX LEGISLATION

The Title IX legislation introduced in both the House and the Senate was not passed.
