APPROVED BUDGET AFFECTS EDUCATION TITLE IX – HIGH SCHOOL MEDICARE DONUT HOLE IS REDUCED IN 2011

# APPROVED BUDGET AFFECTS EDUCATION

As you've probably heard, Congress has approved and the President signed a spending bill for the remainder of the federal government's current fiscal year. Under this plan, which funds programs through the end of September 2011, the budget for Head Start will increase by \$340 million, and the budget for child care will increase by \$100 million. Also, a portion of the \$700 million allocated to Race to the Top will be available to be used in grants to states to improve their early care and education systems.

## TITLE IX - HIGH SCHOOL

HR 458 introduced in February has been referred to the subcommittee on Early Childhood, Elementary and Secondary Education. It deals with requiring high schools to report how they are complying to make sure that females have as equal an opportunity as males to participate in sports. Most high schools offer more opportunities for males to participate in sports. High school students who participate in sports have increased the opportunities of getting college athletics scholarships both in athletics or academics. Girls who have no opportunity to participate in a high school sport have a reduced chance to get a college scholarship. Since there was a similar bill in the Senate in the last session of Congress, presumably a similar bill will be introduced in the Senate before long. The two bills had different reporting procedures which would have to be resolved assuming each passes in its chamber of the Congress.

# MEDICARE DONUT HOLE IS REDUCED IN 2011

Senior citizens who fall into the "Medicare Donut hole" – a coverage gap – will get a 50 percent discount on some prescription drugs when their bills exceed \$2700 retail cost. A new fee on drug makers will also be implemented to help pay for the change. The fine on withdrawing funds from a Health Savings Account for non-medical expenses will increase by 5 to 10 percent.
