

Supporting Beginning Teachers

We were so fortunate to have Dr. Todd Holmes speak at our February meeting. He has been an educator for the last 24 years and his educational career has all been in Johnston County Schools (JCS). He shared that one of our Alpha Beta Sisters, Jenny Moore, was the very first teacher he met when he was on his first teaching interview in JCS. He is now on the Beginning Educator Support Team in JCS and one of his major goals for beginning teachers is to empower them to ask for assistance.

One of the first statistics he shared with us regarding the beginning teachers in JCS was 60% of 1st year teachers didn't go through an education program and have an alternative license. JCS also hires additional teachers each December and this past December 80% of the teachers hired had an alternative license also. Members found this to be a very challenging fact. Additionally, 50% of all K-5 teachers in JCS have an alternative licenses and didn't get to have a student teacher experience.

Dr. Holmes has three members on his team who work with specific schools so they can work on building lasting relationships with beginning teachers. He shared his departments greatest challenge is providing the best support possible for teachers with alternative licenses. First, an orientation is provided at the beginning of each school year for 1st—3rd year teachers. He thanked us for providing refreshments for this event. Next, a late hire orientation is provided for teachers. His team provides professional development in the fall and spring on a variety of topics to include Exceptional Children, ELL and literacy. He challenged us to become a presenter at one of his orientation events. His team also conducts over 500 classroom visits to get a snapshot of what is going on in each teacher's classroom. This enables Dr. Holmes team to give very specific support exactly where the teacher needs it.

Our Beginning Teacher Committee has been working hard on ways to support the teachers in JCS and they presented several ideas at the meeting after Dr. Holmes spoke. One of the ideas was to ask members to complete a ballot with a list of ways to support beginning teachers to include mentoring face-to-face, or virtually. Members were asked to help monetarily also and this could also include providing materials at the beginning of the school year. A motion was passed to provide funds to support this endeavor.


We were so appreciative to Dr. Holmes for sharing details that we need to know in order to provide the best support possible for the new teachers of JCS.





20 TECH TIPS FOR TEACHERS

I discovered a wonderful resource developed by **Kasey Bell**. I have shared the first twelve (12) of twenty of her tips. She believes these tips will help teachers be even more successful as they embrace technology in the classroom.

There is a short description of tips thirteen (13) - sixteen (16). If you want to get additional information, you can check out the links and resources provided by Kasey in her book, **Shake Up Learning!** Also, you can subscribe to Kasey's podcasts and blog posts on her Web site.

- 13. **Use New Tools to Do New Things** You need to think beyond using digital tools to complete only traditional assignments such as papers and reports. Digital tools can be used to do new things. Use new tools to go further, go deeper and extend your students' learning. Reach beyond what you think a digital tool can do and challenge your students to demonstrate their learning in a new way.
- 14. **Give Students Voice and Choice** This may be as simple as giving students a choice in the digital tool they use to demonstrate their learning. It doesn't have to be complicated, but you will be pleasantly surprised at the outcome and the depth of understanding when you give students a little extra room to make their own decisions in their learning.
- 15. **Get Organized** You can organize the information, directions, objectives, and resources online for your learners. Give students ONE central location or website will allow students to focus on the learning tasks. and to help you enhance this learning experience.
- 16. **Package Your Online Assignments** Give your students ALL of the information they will need for the assignment/project online. Provide the detailed directions, the rubric, the due date, detail collaborative expectations, where and how to turn it in, what to do if they finish early. This will save you so much time answering questions.

Message From President Cowan

Dr. Teresa H. Cowan, NC DKG President, shares that the DKG's Founders crafted core values and goals that laid the foundation of the Society. Next came the seven purposes as the "pillars" of the Society. She believes there is a cornerstone of sorts found in **Purpose 1—"To unite women educators of the world in a genuine spiritual fellowship"** and it is that cornerstone for DKG. She wants to know if we can see how Purpose 1 and NC DKG Ready, Set, GROW! bring serendipitous moments into the lives of DKG members. She wants to offer first-hand experiences that showcase this purpose while capturing **Ready, Set, GROW**!

In the summer of 2019 an auction was held at the DKG Arts & Humanities Conference in Asheville. A piece was priced to sell but plans had been made to auction if needed. The auction resulted in four times the amount for which the piece was originally marked. The bonus was the recipient (a DKG member from TN) and the weaver have now

become dear DKG sisters, and the Society benefited from the proceeds as the funds were donated to the DKG Emergency Fund.

In the winter of 2020 a Region IV member placed a badge order. The recipient of the order noticed the name of the purchaser was the exact name of a person she taught with years ago but had not seen or heard from in ages. They were able to unite because she had scheduled to visit that person's chapter in the next two weeks. When the two connected it was like they were still standing at their old school.

Dr. Cowan shared that serendipity is the phenomenon of finding valuable or pleasant things that are not looked for. She believes that Purpose #1 is just that purposeful. She wants us to know that DKG is more than just fellowship. The examples she shared showcases how genuine spiritual fellowships can take us across state, regional and generational boundaries. She wants to challenge us to take time to reflect upon moments in your DKG life when things happen that you cannot explain. She wants to chalk them up to Serendipity! **It is a DKG thing!**
