


20 TECH TIPS FOR TEACHERS shakeup.link/techtips

20 TECH TIPS FOR TEACHERS

In the last three newsletters, I shared sixteen (16) of twenty (20) tips developed by **Kasey Bell**. She believes these tips will help teachers be even more successful as they embrace technology in the classroom.

There is a short description of tips seventeen (17) - twenty (20). I hope you have had a chance to look closely at her tips and hopefully integrated some of them into your classroom. Don't forget to check out the links and resources provided by Kasey in her book, **Shake Up Learning!** Also, you can subscribe to Kasey's podcasts and blog posts on her Web site.

- 17. Don't assess the Bells and Whistles;
 Content is King Always remember to go back to the learning goals when it comes to assessing student work. Instead of using rubrics that look at the number of slides, pictures, etc., use a rubric that focuses on the content and skills that the lesson was designed to teach.
- 18. Publish for a Global Audience It is important to find ways to give students the opportunity to publish for a global audience. Allow students to publish their work, their writing, their videos, and projects. The quality of their work will change and it can help them build a positive online presence.
- 19. Always have a Plan B Things do not always go as planned when you try to integrate technology in the classroom. Having a Plan B mean knowing what you will do if the lesson just isn't working out. Be prepared to transition to Plan B to ensure you don't lose an entire instructional period.
- 20. **Share Your Voice** Take the time to reflect on the use of technology in the classroom. Then be open to share your honest reflections on your fears, what went well or where you failed. It is an important part of the learning process and can help students cultivate a growth mindset. They will begin to reflect on their learning and understand the process is part of their learning journey. Students should be encouraged to reflect as well.





Message From President Cowan

Dr. Teresa H. Cowan, NC DKG President, shares a message entitled, **Destruction or Construction? A Matter of Perspective.** She begins the message with the following quote by Cynthia Occelli, "For a seed to achieve its greatest expression, it must come completely undone. The shell cracks, its insides come out and everything changes. To someone who doesn't understand growth, it would look like complete destruction." I think this quote makes the biennium theme, **Ready, Set, GROW!** even more meaningful. As we reflect on this quote, **President Cowan** invites us to glance into the past, gaze into the present, and see a glimpse into the future.

The Shell Cracks

Sadly, several NC DKG events had to be cancelled due to the pandemic. This was very challenging and DKG leadership was force to face the reality that the convention would be cancelled and New Leaders' Training would not be conducted face-to-face. Looking back at the guote, Dr. Cowan sees

these events similar to a crack in the shell of NC DKG. These events were the focal points of our Society and Dr. Cowan felt the shell had been cracked and members felt undone.

Its Insides Come Out

Dr. Cowan sees the insides are coming out as leaders evaluate traditional methods of conducting business. She realizes that members are facing uncertainty also. They are looking at how they will go back to school. Dr. Cowan believes the uncertainty of today exposes everything from the inside out.

Everything Changes

Lastly, Dr. Cowan shares as the shell cracks and the insides come out, the seed can change and achieve greatness. This gives us such hope as we look at how we will approach our events to include the NC DKG. Convention and chapter events. We will look at using virtual meetings and slideshow presentations. Dr. Cowan wants us to remember that when things change, there can be GROWTH.

She reminds us that "Growing isn't always pretty, but it's always worth it." She wants us to think about it like this: "when the seed is experiencing destruction it makes possible the opportunity for construction." We are all encouraged to see the destruction of a seed (traditions/habits/routine) as the construction of a flower (growth/change/modernization).



Marketing DKG: Making a Plan

Marketing DKG can be simple with a plan. The International Communications and Marketing Committee has developed a starting place for state organizations and chapters to create a plan using a simple five-step process. The easy-to-follow marketing plan template is designed to help states and chapters create and build awareness for any type of project or need they might have. The idea is to take each need one step at a time and break it into actions to accomplish the goal.

- ✓ **Step 1.** Identify and find target audience: Marketing goals will generally take one of two forms — internal (to members) or external (to nonmembers), so the first step in marketing is deciding who your plan is intended to impact audience and where you will find that target audience.
- ✓ Step 2. Grab attention of target audience: You

must get the target's attention before you can share what you want to tell them. This can be accomplished as simply as through an email or in as detailed a way as via a multipronged media campaign.

- ☑ Step 3. Build the relationship: Lay a solid foundation by building trust and rapport. Contact the target audience in multiple ways and many times, if needed, with your message. Be personal and open so they see the value in the relationship. Communication is key in building relationships
- Step 4. Follow-up: Keep the relationship going. Take the initiative and contact the target audience again. Answer questions and pose some of your own to get them involved and excited. Set reminders to follow up if needed!
- ✓ Step 5. Close the "sale": Once you have them under the shelter of your umbrella, complete the goal, whether it is getting a prospect to join or getting funding from a community business. You may need to circle back to building the relationship and following up, but the end result will be worth it — you will have reached your goal!
