Wordle - Word Cloud

If you want to enhance assignments, activities and/or projects, try out this Web 2.0 tool, **Wordle**. This tool is used to generate "word clouds" from text. The more frequently a word appears in the text, the larger it shows up in the word cloud. An example of a Wordle is shown below. Notice the larger words are the ones that show up the most in the text used to create the Wordle.


21st Century Educational Technology and Learning is an educational Web site that shares 125 ways to use Wordle in
