Screencast-o-Matic http://www.screencasto-matic.com/

Screencast-o-Matic

One of my most favorite resources for creating short videos is **Screencast-o-Matic**. It is so easy to use and is **FREE**. It is as easy as clicking the "**Start Recording**" button.

This Web tool works best with **Internet Explorer** instead of Firefox. All of the videos are stored for free on the company's server. You do need to create an account to access the videos you save on their server. You can download all of the videos you create to your computer if you don't want to create an account.

Make sure you have updated versions of Java on your computer. It is safe to download Java if the tool recognizes your computer needs an update. Follow the steps below.

- 1. Use the Internet browser, Internet Explorer. If you use Firebox, you will need to make sure your Java plugin is updated.
- 2. Go to the Web site; http://www.screencast-o-matic.com/.
- 3. In the upper right-hand of the Web page, click on the "Start Recording" button.
- 4. Once the program opens, you will see a **red button** in the lower left-hand corner.
- 5. Push the red button to begin and end the recording.
