There is an excitement in the air this school year Johnston County Educators! Our Opening Convocation at Five County Stadium was hot, informative, and inspiring. My thanks to our JCPS superintendent, Dr. Ross Renfrow, for his vision of inspiring school leaders to give our very best to our students each day. Quick reality check: I don't think we've been holding back, but a bit of positivity such as the convocation does boost one's attitude.

Board Chair Mike Wooten announced a 1% increase in our supplement. It doesn't sound like much until it's put in perspective. The Board of Education members voted to take \$1.5 million from the fund balance to make that happen this year, even though Johnston County didn't fund the supplement increase. That's \$1.5 million from savings that the Board will have to figure out how to duplicate annually and the "savings account" can't support it long term. This year it's a relatively small gift. However, if we get the projected State salary increases, that 1% will be a real gift in

the long run.

Dr. Renfrow introduced our key note speaker, Curtis Zimmerman, and one hour passed very quickly as he kept us engaged and inspired. I must say that I will be forever grateful that I didn't excel at "Simon Says" and become the center of attention, learning to juggle in front of thousands. Mr. Zimmerman drove his point home with his activities - as teachers we must celebrate the failures that lead to the... See Page 2.

Advocating for Students



One of our members, Mary Nell Ferguson, addressed the Johnston County Board of Education to express her concerns about the direction of some local schools.

Mary Nell is a retired principal of Cleveland Elementary School and said her concern was on the elementary schools in the I-95 corridor. She shared data to show where there are economically disadvantaged students.

"I want it to be heard loud and clear that my concerns are not our principals, not the teachers, not the facilities, but the inequities of the Smithfield schools as compared to Cleveland-Clayton schools." She suggested school leaders consider magnet schools as an option to improve Smithfield area schools.

She also asked the board to examine each school and plan a unique, proven solution for it. She wanted the board to take time to answer the "Why" question. Why, through the years, have parents transferred their children out of the Smithfield-Selma area schools?"

We are so fortunate to still have Mary Nell looking out for the welfare of all of the students in Johnston County.

Legislative Update



Lynn Ragsdale, one of our most active chapter members, is also a member of the **Eta State Educational Law and Policy Committee**. She worked closely with the Educational Law and Policy Committee Chairman, **Susan Phipps**, to survey Eta State members, who were asked for their top educational priorities. The data from members would be shared with NC legislators to help them make informed decisions for legislation involving educational issues. The priorities include:

- ☑ DKG encourages the General Assembly to increase salaries for all educators.
- DKG feels strongly that NC must continue to provide medical and retirement benefits for all teachers and state employees
- While we believe in accountability, our members strongly encourage a reduction in the amount of testing.
- Our membership believes that any schools that receive state tax dollars should be held equally accountable to the state for student learning
- ☑ DKG encourages the General Assembly to increase per-pupil funding.
- Our membership opposes the allocation of public funds for private and religious school vouchers.
- ☑ DKG is opposed to the current A-F system of grading public schools.
- Our members urge that the number of charter schools in North Carolina be limited to 170.

LibiVox https://librivox.org/

LibriVox

Here is a new Web 2.0 tool that is rated as one of the top 10 Web 2.0 tools for teachers. It is called, **LibriVox**. The main objective of this Web 2.0 tool is, "**To make all books in the public domain available, for free, in audio format on the internet."**

LibriVox recruits volunteers to record chapters of books in the public domain, and then they release the audio files back onto the net for free. All our audio is in the public domain, so you may use it for whatever purpose you wish.

There are several options for listening. The first step is to get the audio files into your own computer. There are two main ways to do this:

1. Thrice-Weekly Podcast

LibiVox podcasts one book at a time, with three audio installments a week. To subscribe to the podcast, copy and paste this URL into your podcatcher: http://librivox.org/podcast.xml



All you need is a computer, a microphone, some free recording software, and your own voice. You don't need to audition, but they do suggest a 1-Minute Test recording just to check your setup. We'll accept you no matter what you sound like.


