Tagul

In the last newsletter I shared the Web 2.0 tool Wordle, This tool is used to generate "word clouds" from text. The Web tool I want to share with you is **Tagul** and it is very similar to Wordle with a few additional features. Also, it's free to use except for a few features that are accessible in a Premium subscription.

Tagul word clouds have unique features like words inside words, large selection of fonts, various cloud shapes, customizable colors, etc.

Tagul also allows for additional customization. You can make every word in your word cloud link to a Web page. Tagul's default setting is setup to go directly to Google, but you can customize it to go to any Web page.

To set up your FREE account, follow the steps below.

- 1. Go to http://tagul.com/.
- 2. Sign up for Tagul. A password will be emailed to you.
- 3. Go back to the Tagual Web site and sign in.
- 4. Select "Create New" and agree to the terms and conditions.
- 5. Copy and paste your text or a URL.
- 6. Designate that links open in a new window.
- 7. Customize your Appearance & Fonts, etc. using the drop down menus.
- 8. View your word cloud by selecting the red "Visualize" button.
- 9. Select "Grab and Share" to save your word cloud as a graphic, print, email it, or put it on the Web.
- 10. Be sure to "Save Changes". Your word cloud will not be saved for later use in the "My Clouds" menu.
