Legislative Update

Eta State Legislative Coordinator Lynn Ragsdale

The Eta State Education Law & Policy Committee wanted to give DKG members an opportunity to let their voice of influence to be heard. A survey was created with 14 different topics to include teacher salaries, merit pay, class size, vouchers, and standardized testing.

Data collected from the survey will allow us to communicate with legislators with greater certainty and confidence on the topics we think are important to us as a society.

The Eta State Education Law & Policy Committee goal is to have 80% of our Eta State members complete the survey. Survey results will be sent to chapter presidents when the data is tallied.

Let Your Voice of Influence Be Heard

At our September meeting there were several discussions related to the power of our voices as educators. We challenged each member to find their voice of influence and let it be heard. I thought you would benefit from reading an article that shows the conviction of a fellow educator and her willingness to share her voice.



The article was printed in the Charlotte Observer and is entitled, "'Hunger Games' Teacher Pay Plan is just Wrong."

Pam Lile, school librarian at Cornelius Elementary, wanted her voice to be heard so she wrote the article related to a hot topic being discussed by NC legislators; teacher pay. She compared what legislators are doing to teacher pay is much like the Hunger Games movie plot. She notes in the article that the General Assembly voted to end all teacher tenure by 2018.

Legislators are going to ask school systems to determine their top 25 percent teachers and offer only these teachers a four-year contract and a \$5,000 pay raise for that period. All other teachers will be hired on one-year contracts, with no possibility for tenure. She doesn't want to see our good teachers being pitted against each other in a battle for adequate compensation.

The good news is state leaders across many of our school districts are challenging the change, and urging lawmakers to reconsider. As educators, what topics do we believe need to be challenged? A way you can be heard is by completing the survey developed by the **Eta State Education Law & Policy Committee**. See information above on how to access survey.

Remind 101

As an educator, I'm always looking for ways to connect with students and parents. Since both students and parents are more tech savvy than ever before, there are lots of new Web 2.0 tools that teachers can use to connect with them.

I want to thank Amy Stanley for sharing this resource. It is a safe way for teachers to send text message to students as well as stay in touch with parents. The good news is this resource is **FREE**.

We are trying this tool out in our Chapter to connect with members to show it effectiveness. I hope teachers will find it is a valuable resource and use it with students and/or parents. I've included instructions below on how to get set up.

- 1. To sign up for Remind 101, go to https://www.remind101.com/
- 2. Next, provide your **full name**, **email address** and a **password** in the text box provided.
- 3. Add your first class by providing the name of the class you want to set up i.e. math, first period, etc.
- 4. Next, grab your smart phone & subscribe to your new class. A specific phone number will be provided for the new class. Follow all of the directions provided online as you are going through the set up process.
- 5. Once you have completed the set up process, you will want to add students and/or parents to the account.
- 6. Click on the button entitled, **Invite Subscribers**. A popup box will appear of a screenshot including the phone number and message you will need to send to students and/or parents so they can sign up to receive text messages from you.
- 7. Parents and students will subscribe to the free service using their smart phones.
- 8. A confirmation message will be sent back to the students and/or parents so they know they have successfully signed up to receive text messages from you.

Hope you find this a valuable resource to help you connect with both students and/or parents.
