



DKG International President

President Carolyn Pittman asks us to look closely at the different ways we can approach our members. She believes that when we look at membership, for example, it may appear a member is not active, but it may be the best a member can do at that stage of her life and career. She shares that all members can and do fulfill commitments even though their paths are different. As I think about our membership, I think she is right. We have members with families that sometimes share they do not have the time and money to attend meetings (chapter, state organization) because personal resources are required elsewhere at the time. I think that we have members who find themselves at another stage of life when meeting attendance is affected by loss of access to easy transportation because of health or age. We also have retired members who tell us they have too many commitments to attend regularly.

President Pittman believes that if we expect traditional practices to always "fit" our members is much like one-size-fits-all garments. She points out that if we implement inflexible chapter practices (e.g., always meeting at the same time and place or initiating new members in specific months only) it will not "fit" all

members all the time and will cause some members to be left out. We have to consider that commitment to DKG may have different "looks." She agrees that attendance is important because what occurs at meetings builds personhood beyond the schoolhouse. However, we need to know that attendance is only one way to evidence commitment. Paying dues, overseeing short-term projects, being present in the community and school, and maintaining communication are also significant indications of member involvement. She asks us to honor members where they are in their stages of life.
