Tech Tip - Rejuvenate with Blogs

The daily work of a teacher is taxing to say the least, but sometimes when there is a break and you want to rejuvenate your energy. A few minutes reading a good blog can help create a little reflection on your practice and provide fresh ideas that save time and help you feel more productive.



Now you might be saying - when do I have time for that? or where do I even start?

Here are a few creative ways to find the time:

- 1.On your commute to work if you have 15 minutes either way you can use one of those to listen to a podcast or blog using a reader like Voice Dream https://www.voicedream.com/reader/
- 2.On a workday have it playing in the background while you grade papers or change your bulletin board
- 3. During your planning for just a few minutes 1 day a week (then set it aside to let it marinate til next week or use the idea that week to see if it helps you)

Scholarship Opportunity for Members

One of the DKG Purposes is "To endow scholarships to aid outstanding women educators in pursuing graduate study and to grant fellowships to nonmember women educators." NC DKG offers scholarships for postbaccalaureate and doctorate studies. Applications are now online and are due February 1, 2022. (There is also a link on the NC DKG homepage.)

Information requested for the application includes three letters of reference, official transcripts or documentation of enrollment in the program, a copy of a current teaching/administration license, an essay on what DKG means to you, and a listing of related DKG experiences. Applicants are encouraged to begin gathering application materials now. Contact Scholarship Committee Chair Michelle Benigno with questions.

Over 30 scholarships are awarded each year through the DKG International Educators Foundation (DKGIEF) to members pursuing advanced degrees. Scholarships for those seeking other graduate studies are \$6,000 and a doctorate is \$10,000.

Those applications are also due **February 1, 2022**. NC DKG members may apply for both an NC DKG and an International scholarship within a given year. The membership requirement for International applicants is three years for doctoral studies and one year for other graduate studies and two calendar years from induction for NC DKG. NC DKG Educational Foundation also offers scholarships. The Spring grant cycle will include awarding five grants, as well as the Groves-Little, Richards, Simmons-Longest, and the Church. **The due date for these is January 31, 2022**.
