Criteria for Membership

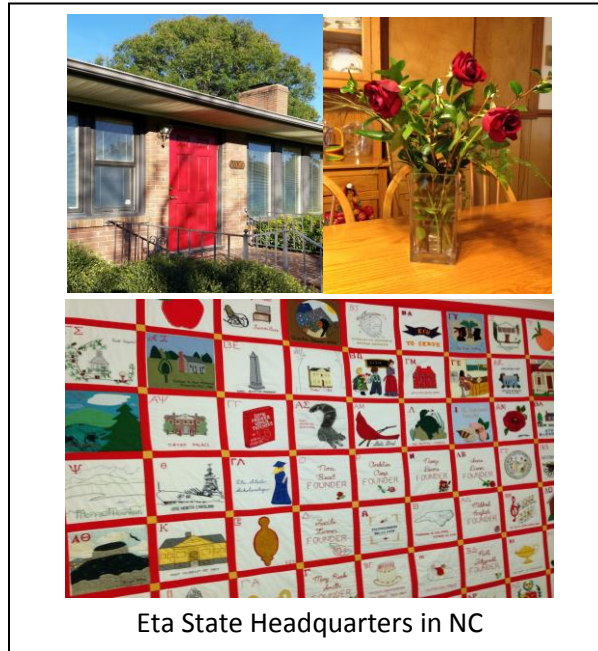
About DKG
