Moving on to more society business led us to the Treasurer's and Finance Committee Report given by Heidi Hull (Omicron), State Treasurer and Linda Getschman (Nu), State Finance Chair. It's nice to report that we are not broke. There are also funds available from the Annie Webb Blanton Scholarship Fund and the Martha Schultz Doctoral Fund. Some important committees were formed. A committee was formed to plan and present the 2024 new Chapter Officer Summer Leadership Training. Information will be coming next year.

Since it has become difficult for most chapters to host and finance our State Conventions, a committee was formed to look into venues and determining feasibility of inperson vs. virtual conventions. Once the committee gets going, we will be seeking out thoughts, comments and ideas from members.

A major change was made to the Gold Key Award. There will no longer be an award. It was decided by an appointed committee to use the criteria as a guide. 


