Clair knew from childhood she wanted to teach. She attended schools in Portland, but wanted to see the world before college. She joined the U.S. Navy and was active duty from 1991-95. She attended U of O and began teaching at North Eugene High in 1999. In 2006, as a Naval Reservist, Clair was called to serve a year in Iraq where she briefed 3- & 4-star generals on intelligence and served as team leader for anti-IED patrols. Clair was honored as Educator of the Year by the Nobel Peace Laureate Project; she is widely recognized for efforts promoting nonviolence in education through the "Peace, Justice and Human Rights" curriculum that she co-developed with Pam McCarthy.

Dr. Pierce taught middle-school English, social studies, and drama for 30 yrs. She taught English Methods in the MAT Ed. Dept. for 10 yrs. Lura earned a PhD in Curriculum and Instruction at the University of Oregon. She taught laughter workshops for 25 yrs.; was voted "One of the Top Five Funniest People in Eugene" by *The Register* Guard; and was Teacher-of-the-Year in Spokane. Lura earned the American Laureate Nobel Peace Project's first Teacher-of-the-Year award in Eugene. She traveled the world for a year after retirement with a peace quilt, gathering children's visions of peace. Lura continues to spread the peace message throughout (cont. p. 3)

the nation. In her journey around the world, she gathered a million visions of peace on postcards in one year. After studying the life of Eleanor Roosevelt, Lura spent a year in the one-woman show entitled *Eleanor Roosevelt* where she shared Mrs. Roosevelt's passion and work.

Lura's blog includes the following advice from the imaginary Mrs. R.: "Get involved. Get busy. You must do the things you think you cannot do...for it isn't enough to talk about peace. One must believe in it. And it isn't enough to believe in it. One must work at it." This quote seems to sum up how Lura Pierce embodies life, believing in and working toward peace.

### BYLAWS & STANDING RULES REPORT

The Alpha Rho State Bylaws committee has completed its work for changes this biennium. You will find that complete work printed in this edition of The New Oregon Trail, pp. 10-14. However, I would like to make a short statement regarding our work. There really are only two changes: (1) the International change regarding fees for an honorary member and (2) the State issue regarding the position of historian. Moving the Awards section to the Standing Rules (they are now in the Bylaws) takes up most of the text. We believe that this material is better suited to the Standing Rules and have been so advised by the International Parliamentarian.

A number of motions passed at our last two conventions. These changes will appear in the newly printed and revised *Standing Rules* and *Bylaws* documents but, having already passed, do not come before the convention for vote in 2015.
