Attracting New Members

- Invite members from professions that are involved in education outside the traditional classroom in order to bring diversity into the chapter.
- Publicize the chapter projects in every possible way. Educators want to be involved in doing good works, and such projects attract them to ΔΚΓ. Inspire them to membership.
- Create a CHAPTER brochure to attract new members.
- Create "goodie bags" to give to newer educators in local school districts. Include a recently designed chapter brochure, a brochure on membership obtained from International Headquarters, and other small items.
- Newspaper articles with educational spotlights are used to recruit new members. A special letter to those in the news can be composed by the Chapter or State Membership Committee and shared with all chapters for this purpose.
- Send letters to school administrators of area schools, encouraging principals' recommendations for new chapter members. Include area schools that currently have no members in the chapter.
- Celebrate community members who contribute their time and talent to education; consider them for chapter honorary membership.
- Send letters to members who resigned from the chapter some years ago and encourage them to be reinstated to membership.
