The training was held at Henry Horton State Park in their lodge. We began with dinner on Friday night and an after-dinner evening session that lasted until nearly 10 P.M. Central time. The seminar then lasted all day Saturday. Susie and I were safely at home by 9 P.M. Saturday.

The seminar centered on a book by Rosamund and Benjamin Zander, called "The Art of Possibility." This book highlights a different way of thinking about leadership and life in general. Benjamin is an educator and orchestra conductor and uses

a lot of his real life experiences from his classes and students as examples. Rosamund is a family therapist, so she helps to ground the practices and experiences in this book.

We were honored to have Beverly Smith (President Xi State, 2013—2015) and Dorrie Powell (Xi State Presidential Nominee) as guests of the seminar. It was an enlightening experience and one that I hope many of you will decide to try at a future seminar!

Alpha Phi Meeting Minutes March 7, 2015 Friendship House, Hixson United Methodist Church, 10:00 a.m.

Members in attendance at Alpha Phi's March meeting were: Faye Hitchcock, Mary Holland, Sherry McCullough, Sharon McMahan, Ann Moore, Judy Nixon, Barbara Northcut, Laurie Richardson, Sandy Smith, Jensi Souders, Amy Thompson and Patsy Woodham.

Following fellowship and food (furnished by Richardson, Smith, Souders and Westbrook), President Souders called the meeting to order at 10:15 a.m. She welcomed all, but especially Hitchcock, McCullough and Wilhoite, who were attending their first meeting of the year); ill and absent members were noted and updates given. Souders noted that all but seven chapter members have participated in at least one chapter meeting or project during this year, equaling **84%** member participation for the year. While the goal of 100% was missed, the percentage of improvement over the previous year was excellent.

Synopses of the December and February meetings (no business conducted), as well as directions to the Founders' Day Luncheon Site were distributed.

Richardson presented the treasurer's report in Westbrook's absence. Balance on hand October 31 was \$4,610.41. Disbursements October-March 7 totaled \$4,048.74. Income for the same period totaled \$4,287.04, with a balance on March 7, 2015, of \$4848.71. The report was accepted and filed.

Katie Graham (Wolftever Creek Elementary) and Amy Dendy (ER Middle) presented the materials that their mini-grants allowed them to purchase, and explained how the materials were furthering educational excellence in their classrooms.

Following the program, committee reports were heard from Finance (May Belk Charity Sale participation), Membership (looking ahead to fall member recruitment), Educational Excellence (CGLA Tour, Books from Birth, HS Essay Contest), Planning (Chapter Success Plan), and Educational Services (\$100 drawing for member currently active in education—Mary Holland was the winner).

Remembering Martha Becton

Martha Becton passed away on March 13th at the age of 87. She had been a member of Delta Kappa Gamma for over fifty years. Sponsored by Adele Baker, she became a member in 1963. She grew up in Murfreesboro and went to Middle Tennessee State University before coming to Chattanooga. While in Chattanooga, she received a master's degree in elementary education from what was then the University of Chattanooga. After teaching briefly in the Chattanooga City Schools starting at Alton Park Elementary, she chose to teach at dependent schools for Air Force families in Germany and Japan. Her friend, Adele Baker, helped her get an interview at Bright School in Chattanooga, where she began

teaching fourth grade in 1963. When Bright School decided they needed a library, they tapped Ms. Becton to organize, set up and run it. This began her career as the Bright School librarian. She was trained by going to Emory University over the summers and earning a master's degree in librarianship. After Dr. Davis retired as head mistress in 1969 and before Sib Evans Sr. was hired in 1970, Ms. Becton served as the interim headmistress for a year. She was quoted as saying, "I preferred the library. I did not want to stay in that position." Martha stayed at Bright until 1978, and then went back to the Chattanooga City Schools and retired from Hixson Elementary in 1993. It should also be noted that Martha served on the board of the Chattanooga Area Schools Federal Credit Union (CASFCU) for 41 years!
