A Note From the President

You can find those quality educators, not just in the classroom or administration; they may be resource personnel (guidance, library, consultants, etc.), former student teachers in your classroom, tutors, private instructors, GED instructors, corporate trainers, zoo educators, and anywhere else that people work to educate youth or adults. They may even have been a member at one time and now is the time they'd like to reinstate!

You may find them in your church Sunday school class, in the choir, at Weight Watchers, the garden club, your civic club, or at the exercise facility. They may be your next-door neighbor.

Please broaden your periscope to search out those who would benefit from membership (scholarships, PD grants, educational project grants, fellowship, encouragement, etc.), and plan to nominate one or more in August or September for membership in Alpha Phi.
