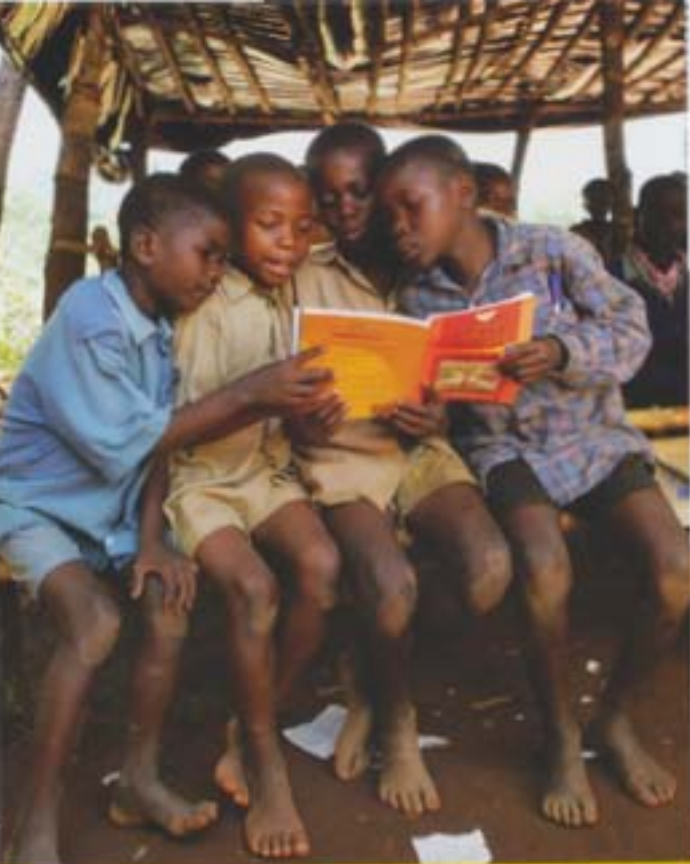

In Zimbabwe, Agnes Mutima has been caring for her six grandchildren since their mothers died. She's eager for the children to get a good education — and that includes having a safe, dry place to learn. "These are our children and they need a good environment to study in," says Ms. Mutima. She was thrilled when UNICEF's Schools for Africa program came to her village to build a new school. "When it rained, these children were rained on — when it was cold, they were very cold. This will now change, and they will have a proper primary education."
