Nikki Thomas, from Golden Girl, Inc., gave a passionate presentation at the November 9 meeting held in the Pea Ridge Baptist Church. Golden Girl, Inc. is "A Therapeutic Group Home for Girls" located in Ceredo, West Virginia. Up to twenty-four girls, ages 12 to 21, are accepted by referral with specific admission criteria. The home specializes in helping girls who, for instance, have low self esteem, have been sexually abused, have truancy problems in school, or have special education needs. Their brochure states: "Our program is designed around a basic goal to fulfill the children's needs in an atmosphere where they can learn to feel loved, wanted, valued, accepted, encouraged and assisted to mature and grow to reach their maximum potential." Alpha Chapter members donated hats, gloves and scarves to the girls.
